<u>Please note:</u> Students exiting early with one component of a dual degree must complete the single degree requirements of that component. Students will then be required to follow the single degree rules to complete the remaining component from that dual degree and maximum credit rules will apply.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete 64 units, comprising -

- 28 units for all BCom/BEcon Core Courses; and
- 16 units for a BCom major; and
- 16 units from the BEcon component, comprising either -
 - a second BEcon major; or
 - o BEcon Flexible Core Courses (8 units must be at level 3); and
- · 4 units of general electives

Note:

Courses can only count towards one program (not both) –

 Students may not count ECON2300 towards the Finance major, as it is a compulsory course for the BEcon.
