Please note: Students exiting early with one component of a dual program must complete the single program requirements of that component. Students will then be required to follow the single program requirements to complete the remaining component from that dual program and maximum credit rules will apply.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete 64 units, comprising –

- 24 units for all BBusMan/BTHEM Core Courses; and
- 16 units for a BBusMan major; and
- 16 units for a BTHEM major; and
- 8 units of general electives

Note:

Selected courses must include at most 32 units at level 1
